


Safety Culture By: Kyle Vang

<u>UCP LIFT & TRANSFER RULES</u> Please Don't Break Any of These Rules!

- 1. Always use a mechanical lift device to lift and transfer your client, if one is available.
- 2. Never lift or transfer a client by yourself!
- 3. Lifting a client is always a two-person lift, especially if the client weighs more than 25 pounds!
- 4. Never lift any objects that weigh more than 25 pounds by yourself!
- 5. Do not lift an unconscious client from the ground unless the scene is unsafe.
- 6. Do not attempt to catch a falling client if you are not in the right position to do so safely.
- 7. Do not hold on to a client who is having a seizure or is collapsing.

When you need to lift or transfer a client:

the room.

- ⇒ Ensure another person is available to assist you.

 Never lift or transfer the client alone. It is better to wait for help and take a little longer than to rush and take a risk of sustaining an injury.
- ⇒ Assess how you will both lift or transfer the client.

 Decide where and how to hold the client.
- ⇒ Plan your transfer and clear the path.


 Check for obstacles and obstructions (i.e., furniture, electrical cords, other clients, etc.). Also check for grease, oil, moisture, and sharp edges in the surrounding area.
- ⇒ Move the wheelchair and client as close to the transfer location as possible. If the client is in a wheelchair, push the client close to the area you will be lifting or transferring the client to, instead of carrying the client across
 - Remember to lock the brakes of the wheelchair.
- ⇒ Together, count 1-2-3 and right after the third count, lift and/or transfer the client to transfer location.
